North East Students' Programme for Awareness, Reach, and Knowledge on Space (NE-SPARKS)

This idea was conceptualized by the Hon'ble Home Minister. This pioneering initiative aims to spark curiosity and raise awareness about space science and technology by organizing a visit for 800 bright science students—100 from each of the eight North Eastern states—to Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO), Bengaluru.

Over the coming months, up to November 2025, additional student batches from each state will participate, culminating in a landmark initiative to engage the North East's most promising students in the fields of space science.

This is a collaborative effort between the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER), the North Eastern Council (NEC), ISRO, North Eastern Space Applications Centre (NESAC), and the respective State Governments of the North Eastern States. The total sanctioned budget is ₹3.83 crore, funded in a 60:40 ratio—₹2.3 crore from NEC and ₹1.53 crore collectively from the State Governments (₹19.18 lakh per state).

A group of another second batch of 100 students from the eight North Eastern States visited the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) Centre in Bengaluru on 26th and 27th June 2025, as part of the North East Students' Programme for Awareness, Reach, and Knowledge on Space (NE-SPARKS), funded by the North Eastern Council.

A group of 100 students from all eight North Eastern States visited prominent ISRO centres, Bangalore offering them a unique opportunity to witness India's advancements in space technology and research. Over the course of the two-day visit in Bengaluru, the students explored key ISRO facilities. On the first day, they visited the ISRO Telemetry, Tracking and Command

Network (ISTRAC). On the second day, they toured the U R Rao Satellite Centre (URSC) including a comprehensive visit to the ISRO Satellite Integration and Test Establishment (ISITE). The students also watched exclusive footage of the successful Chandrayaan-3 mission and explored a detailed space exhibition featuring satellite systems, scaled satellite models, and informative displays on satellite technologies. This experience significantly immersive broadened their understanding of space science and ignited interest in pursuing careers in astronomy, space research, and related Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) fields.



Boost to Tourism Development in Nagaland: Inauguration of NEC funded project Establishment of services Block (Enopen Tourist Resort) at Khonoma village, Kohima," Nagaland.

Giving a significant boost to tourism development in Nagaland, the project "Establishment of Service Block (Enopen Tourist Resort)" at Khonoma village, Kohima was formally inaugurated on May 15, 2025, by Shri Temjen Imna Along, Hon'ble Minister for Tourism & Higher Education, Government of Nagaland. The inauguration ceremony was also graced by Hon'ble Members of the North Eastern Council (NEC), Shri Longki Phangcho and Shri Tenzing Norbu Thongdok.

With the inauguration of this facility, tourist footfall is expected to rise substantially—particularly in Khonoma village and across Nagaland. The project is anticipated to contribute significantly to the state's economy by enhancing the tourism infrastructure and improving visitor experience in this culturally and environmentally significant destination.



Projects Completed

Arunachal Pradesh

Completion of Two NEC-Funded Road Connectivity Projects in Tawang, Arunachal Pradesh – June 2025

Two road connectivity projects funded by the North Eastern Council (NEC) in Tawang, Arunachal Pradesh—(i) Construction of road from Babrang (Murga) Bridge Point to Rho Village (L-15 km) and (ii) Upgradation of road from NH-13 to Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad—were successfully completed and officially closed in June 2025.

The first project, Construction of the road from Babrang (Murga) Bridge Point to Rho Village (15 km), was sanctioned in March 2019 at a total cost of ₹26.50 crore. Aimed at improving connectivity in remote areas of Tawang, this 15 km all-weather road now links key tourist destinations such as Chumi-Geyser, Gongkhar-La Pass, and Gori-Chen Peak, while also providing access to strategic defense locations near the China border. The project has also fulfilled a longstanding demand of the local tribal communities by facilitating the transport of agricultural, horticultural, and livestock produce to the Jang market, thereby improving livelihoods and boosting the local economy.



The second project, Upgradation of the road from NH-13 to Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad, was sanctioned in April 2022 with an approved cost of ₹20.84 crore. Officially completed and closed in June 2025, the upgraded road passes through several important locations, including Bomdir, Manjushree Orphanage, Nehru Gonpa, the Brigade area, and the Craft Centre. It now serves as a vital intra-town link within significantly Tawang, easing congestion and reducing travel time. The road enhances to access critical institutions such as schools, colleges, defense establishments, the Tawang Monastery, and the Ugyen Tsangpo Helipad. This improved connectivity supports both local mobility and strategic movement, benefiting residents, tourists, dignitaries alike.

These two completed projects mark a significant milestone in strengthening infrastructure, promoting tourism, and enhancing strategic accessibility in the region.

Completion of NEC-Funded Power Project "System Improvement of 11 KV/LT Lines with Upgradation of Different Capacities of Distribution Transformers including Auto Re-closures on 11 KV Feeders under Tawang Electrical Sub-Division, Tawang, West District, Arunachal Pradesh".

This project which was sanctioned in March 2022 at an estimated cost of ₹7.92 crorewas successfully completed and officially closed in June 2025. The project was sanctioned with the objective of enhancing voltage regulation, improving the reliability and quality of power supply, and increasing the quantum of electricity available.

It also aimed to reduce Transmission & Distribution (T&D) and Aggregate Technical & Commercial (AT&C) losses. It also aimed to avoid the contraction and snapping of overhead conductors during shivering winter, thereby reducing unwanted power interruptions, and to increase Government Revenue through stable power supply.



Prior to its implementation, residents experienced frequent power interruptions, particularly during peak hours due to high load demands. Following the project's completion, the power supply in Tawang and surrounding areas has become significantly more stable and reliable. The improved power infrastructure has also enabled the growth of small-scale cottage industries in the region, contributing to enhanced livelihoods and overall economic development in Tawang.

Assam

Improvement of widening of Road from Chaygaon to Ukium in Assam (L- 22.20 km)

This completed road project will significantly enhance connectivity and infrastructure for 15 villages, directly benefiting a population of 50,000 people. This road will significantly improve the transportation and regional connectivity in Assam.





NEC-funded project titled "Anti-Erosion Measures to Protect Village Uma Nagar Upstream and Its Adjoining Areas from the Erosion of River Gangia, Kokrajhar, Assam" was successfully completed on May-June, 2025.

Sanctioned on March 14, 2018, with an estimated cost of ₹4.05 crore (Rupees Four Crore Five Lakh), the project aimed to protect the village of Uma Nagar from recurrent flash floods and severe riverbank erosion caused by the Gangia River.

The core intervention involved the construction of a 990-meter-long bank revetment to reinforce vulnerable sections of the riverbank.

The revetment has been designed to curb soil erosion, safeguard agricultural land, and protect both public and private assets. Its completion is expected to stabilize the riverbank, preserve existing infrastructure,

and mitigate future flood risks.

The project is projected to benefit an area of approximately 1,250 hectares and a population of about 30,000 people. It is also expected to uplift the socio-economic conditions of the local communities, which primarily comprise economically disadvantaged groups including the Bodo, Rajbongshi, and Muslim populations. In addition, the intervention will help preserve local green cover and forested areas by preventing further erosion, with no anticipated adverse environmental impact.



Manipur

Completion of NEC-Funded Irrigation Project in Thoubal District, Manipur – June 2025

The NEC-funded irrigation project titled "Construction of Mini Barrage across Langathel River near Lamlong Khunou, Thoubal District, Manipur" has been successfully completed in June 2025.

successfully completed in June 2025. Sanctioned in April 2017 at an estimated cost of ₹3.85 crore, the project was undertaken with the primary objective of providing a reliable water source for irrigation to the agricultural fields in Langathel, Phundrei, and Walonpokpi

villages.

Prior to the project, farmers depended on temporary and makeshift arrangements for water supply, which were often damaged during periods of high-water inflow and required frequent repairs. With the construction of a permanent diversion weir and pucca canal system, these challenges have been effectively resolved. The project now ensures year-round water availability for more than 150 hectares of paddy fields, enabling farmers to engage in Rabi cropping and diversify into crops beyond paddy.

The project has significantly improved the scale and variety of agricultural activities in the region. It has particularly benefited marginalized and economically weaker farming communities by enhancing their agricultural productivity and increasing household incomes. Additionally, the consistent irrigation supply has enabled the utilization of previously fallow land during lean seasons, contributing to improved food security and rural livelihoods.



Meghalaya

Providing Sound and Light to Multipurpose Hall at Shillong International Centre for Performing Arts and Culture (SICPAC), Mawkasiang, East Khasi Hills District

A significant cultural infrastructure project in Meghalaya has been successfully completed on 29.04.2025. The project, titled "Providing Sound and Light to Multipurpose Hall at Shillong International Centre for Performing Arts and Culture (SICPAC), Mawkasiang, East Khasi Hills District", was sanctioned on 22nd February 2021 under the NEC with an approved cost of ₹9.80 crore. The entire amount was fully funded and utilized by the NEC, achieving 100% physical progress.

This initiative enhances the functionality of SICPAC as a premier venue for cultural events, performances, and community gatherings. It supports local artists, boosts tourism, and contributes to Meghalaya's cultural and economic development by attracting national and international events.

Improvement including widening of Agia – Medhipara – Phulbari – Tura Road (portion from km 67/600 to km 100/200 = 32.60 km), Meghalaya

This completed road project under the NESIDS (Roads) scheme will significantly enhance connectivity and infrastructure for 10 villages, directly benefiting a population of 6,43,000 people. This road will significantly improve the transportation and regional connectivity in Meghalaya.




NEC-Funded Project for Upgrading Selected RK Mission Schools in Meghalaya Successfully Completed on June 24, 2025

The NEC-funded project for upgrading selected Ramakrishna Mission schools located in East Khasi Hills (Mawsynram/Shella-Bholaganj) and South West Khasi Hills (Ranikor), Meghalaya, was successfully completed on June 24, 2025.

Sanctioned on December 22, 2020, at an estimated cost of ₹4.2997 crore, the project aimed to provide accessible, affordable, and quality education to children from families of marginal workers in remote and underserved areas. It focused on strengthening school infrastructure to address the high dropout rates and limited access to non-commercial Higher Secondary education in these rural blocks.

With the completion of this project, total student enrolment is expected to increase by approximately 45.2%, enabling around 523 students from Below Poverty Line (BPL) families to access higher secondary education annually. This initiative marks a significant step toward enhancing literacy and educational opportunities in the region.





NEC-Funded Project for Construction of Boys' and Girls' Hostel Blocks at Capt. Williamson Sangma Memorial College, Baghmara, Meghalaya Successfully Completed on June 16, 2025

The NEC-funded project for the construction of Boys' and Girls' Hostel Blocks at Capt. Williamson Sangma Memorial College, Baghmara, South Garo Hills, Meghalaya, was successfully completed on June 16, 2025.

Sanctioned in June 2021 at a total cost of ₹1.6666 crore, the project was undertaken with the objective of improving access to higher education for students from remote areas of the district. The newly constructed hostels are intended to accommodate students from Economically Weaker Sections (EWS), thereby removing a key barrier to pursuing higher education.

This initiative reflects NEC's continued commitment to enhancing educational infrastructure and promoting equitable access to quality education, particularly for underserved and vulnerable communities in Meghalaya.



Nagaland

Up gradation of AT Road from Tsuranga to Impur Junction (length- 26.335 km) including 3 nos. of Bridges, Nagaland

The road infrastructure project "Up gradation of AT Road from Tsuranga to Impur Junction (length- 26.335 km) including 3 nos. of Bridges" in Nagaland, has been successfully completed. At a total cost of ₹93.98 crore, the project was officially declared completed.

This project will be hugely benefitted around 18 nos. of villages along with 193171 nos. of population.





Up gradation of Road Chendang Saddle-Noklak (length 12.57 km), (Phase -II), Nagaland

The road infrastructure project "Up gradation of Road Chendang Saddle-Noklak (length 12.57 km), (Phase -II)" in Nagaland, has been successfully completed. At a total cost of ₹45.59 crore, the project was officially declared completed.

This project will be benefitted around 4 nos. of villages along with the population of 59300.



NEC funded road connectivity project "Construction of road from Naga Lempong-Ahom Cave trekking point, Longleng (L-7.432 Km), Nagaland" successfully completed and officially closed in June 2025.

The road connectivity project construction of road from Naga Lempong-Ahom Cave trekking point, Longleng (L-7.432 Km), Nagaland was sanctioned in August 2019 for a total cost of Rs. 12.99 Crores to improve the connectivity in the mentioned areas. After much efforts, the project has been successfully completed and closed in June, 2025. This road project starts from Tuensang Longleng road junction and connects to the renowned tourist destination of Ahom Cave situated in Bhumnyu Village. The Ahom Cave is a historical site linked to the 17th-Century Ahom Raja Gadadhar Singh and holds immense tourism potential. The upgrading of this 7.432 Km road is expected to enhance accessibility, boosting ecotourism, trade, healthcare, security, and governance. Key benefits include improved connectivity for local inhabitants, growth in tourism and related commercial activities. better access to medical, administrative, and security services, and direct benefits to nearby 6 villages and communities.



NEC funded power project "Setting up of Noiroi Mini Hydro Electric Project (Stage -I & II) (4x75kW = 300kW) in Paren District, Nagaland" successfully completed and officially closed in June 2025.

This project was sanctioned by the North Eastern Council in March, 2012 for an estimated cost of Rs. 4.04 crores. The project has been executed successfully and officially closed in June 2025. The primary objective of this project is to increase the power generation unit in Nagaland for a better quality of power supply. Nagaland is noted as an energy-deprived state, heavily relying on imports from the NE Grid to meet its demand. Upon completion, this project ensures energy security and improved quality of power supply to consumers living around the project site. This development is expected to enable the establishment of small cottage industries such as saw mills, rice mills, and drying units. Furthermore, the project has substantially reduced the import of power supply, consequently benefiting the State's revenue.



Tripura

Up gradation of road from Hmunpui (NH-44A) to Damcherra (Tripura-Mizoram border) via Monchuang, Tripura

The road infrastructure project "Up gradation of road from Hmunpui (NH-44A) to Damcherra (Tripura-Mizoram border) via Monchuang" in Tripura, has been successfully completed. At a total cost of ₹84.79 crore, the project was officially declared completed on March, 2025.

The approved road project will significantly enhance connectivity and infrastructure for 9 villages, directly benefiting a population of 2,68,611 people. The project is expected to reduce travel time, lower transportation costs, and contribute to overall rural development and quality of life for the local residents.



Improvement of road from Gandacherra – Rashiyabari road at Ch. 18.30 km to Narikel Kunja (L-8.00 km), Tripura

The road infrastructure project "Improvement of road from Gandacherra – Rashiyabari road at Ch. 18.30 km to Narikel Kunja (L-8.00 km)" in Tripura, has been successfully completed. At a total cost of ₹21.82 crore, the project was officially declared completed.

The approved road project will significantly enhance connectivity and infrastructure for 5 villages, directly benefiting a population of 2300 people. The project is expected to reduce travel time, lower transportation costs, and contribute to overall rural development and quality of life for the local residents.




North Eastern Region Agri-Commidity e-Connect (NERACE) portal

This was launched on 12 July 2024 by Shri Jyotiraditya M Scindia, Hon'ble Union Minister of DoNER. NERACE is expected to significantly enhance the Agro-horti landscape of our region by leveraging technology to connect producers, buyers, and service providers. It facilitates seamless transactions and fostering mutual growth, empowering our farmers by addressing the most vertical aspect of market linkage and supply chain management. The month of April 2025 witnessed robust Agri-trade activity across the North-Eastern states of India, with a total transaction value of ₹49 Lakhs and cumulative trade volume of 188 MT. This reflects the growing momentum of inter-state agricultural marketing and the strengthening of farmer-to-buyer digital trade linkages in the region.

Key highlights of the April, 2025 sales data include:

- Ginger remained the most traded commodity, with varieties like Local and Nadia contributing significantly. Over 184.5 MT of ginger were sold, amounting to ₹47.57 lakhs and Sikkim emerged as the major supplier.
- King Chilli, a premium product from Nagaland and Assam, fetched the highest price per kg (up to ₹3,000), with small yet high-value trades totaling ₹53 Thousands.
- Other traded commodities included Turmeric, Maize Paddy, Black Rice, and Birds Eye Chilli, sourced from states like Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Assam, and Manipur.
- Assam emerged as a major buyer state, while Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Nagaland, and Sikkim served as key seller states.
