Inauguration of the Construction of Cultural Infrastructures for 6 (Six) Sein Raij in East and West Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya

The project titled "Construction of Cultural Infrastructure of 6 (Six) Sein Raij in East and West Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya" was inaugurated on 31st August 2025 by Dr. Sukanta Majumdar, Hon'ble Union Minister of State (Independent Charge), Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), Government of India, in the presence of Shri Sniawbhalang Dhar, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister, Government of Meghalaya.

With a sanctioned amount of ₹1.93 Crore, the project encompasses the development of VIP galleries, approach roads, protective works, land development, and cultural halls, all aimed at supporting community gatherings and the annual Behdeinkhlam festivals — a cornerstone of Jaintia cultural and spiritual life.

The Science Park at Vigyan Gram will serve as a cornerstone of Tripura's efforts to popularize science, eradicate superstition, and build an informed and rational society in consonance with the vision of the North Eastern Council to foster inclusive regional development through innovation, education, and cultural advancement.

Shri Satinder Kumar Bhalla, Secretary of the North Eastern Council (NEC), conducted a comprehensive official visit to Nagaland in the month of August to review key NEC funded projects and inaugurate significant educational infrastructure across the state. The visit began with a courtesy call on Shri Sentiyanger Imchen, Chief Secretary of Nagaland, followed by an inspection of the Library-cum-Museum project at Ungma Village under the IPR sector, showcasing the NEC's commitment to cultural preservation and educational development.



highlight of the visit was inauguration of the International Students Hostel and Research Scholars Hostel at Nagaland University, Lumami, conducted alongside Vice Chancellor Prof. Jagadish K. Patnaik. These state-of-the-art facilities a significant milestone in university's journey toward academic global excellence and engagement, designed to provide conducive living and learning environments for international students and research scholars from diverse backgrounds.

newly inaugurated hostels strategically positioned to foster crossexchange, facilitate cultural academic collaboration, and support advanced initiatives, reflecting research university's growing stature in the academic landscape. The NEC's support in realizing vision underscores the council's dedication to promoting higher education excellence and infrastructure development throughout the Northeast region.

The visit concluded at the Ungma Village Council Assembly Hall, where Secretary Bhalla engaged with local leaders to discuss grassroots development initiatives and the NEC's ongoing commitment to inclusive growth. The ceremony was attended by faculty university officials, members, students, and other dignitaries, making it a momentous occasion that demonstrates the collaborative approach between central agencies, state administration, and local communities in advancing regional development priorities.

Completed Projects (Statewise) during July-Sep 2025

Arunachal Pradesh

1. Construction of road from Kodum CO Hqr- Bam Tri-junction (L- 16.5 Km), West Siang in Arunachal Pradesh under NESIDS (Roads)

The Construction of road from Kodum CO Hqr- Bam Tri-junction in West Siang has been completed under NESIDS. This road, with a length of 16.5 Km and a Project Cost of ₹ 19.50 Crore, connects 4 villages with a population of 112,274.



This strategically important road shortens the distance between the State capital Itanagar and 10 administrative centers including Yomcha, Liromoba, Darak & Kamba of West Siang District, Kaying & Payum of Siang District, and Tato, Monigong, Puli & Mechukha of Shi Yomi District by 36.00 Km. It provides direct connectivity to four remote villages and other important link routes, leading to significant savings in time and resources. This project expected to become an economic corridor, fostering commercial hubs and tourism hotspots. It will be instrumental in uplifting the economic and social status of the local population through employment generation, inter-circle marketing & trading, boosting economic activity neighboring states. Furthermore, it serves as an important alternate route to Aalo -Basar and is crucial for Indian defense movement to border areas.

2. Promotion of arecanut as alternative crops and alternate income source against illegal cultivation of cannabis and opium in various areas of Lekang, Namsai and Chongkham Circles of Namsai Aspirational District, Arunachal Pradesh

The project, titled "Promotion of arecanut as alternative crops and alternate income source against illegal cultivation of cannabis and opium in various areas of Lekang, Namsai and Chongkham Circles of Namsai Aspirational District, Arunachal Pradesh", with an amount of Rs. 5.23 crore under schemes of NEC has completed on 25th July, 2025. The project will increase the production of arecanut and turmeric to meet the demands of local, regional and national markets and it will double farmers income through cash crop farming arecanut and turmeric.

The project has been effectively implemented with essential inputs and direct transfer of cultivation charges to beneficiaries via DBT. All sites are geotagged and uploaded to the State monitoring Portal for transparency. As arecanut has a 6-7 year gestation period, financial returns are yet to begin.

However, once harvesting starts, it will generate employment, boost income, and promote commercial farming, reducing dependence on illicit crops like cannabis and opium. Farmers are also being encouraged to adopt organic practices, supporting sustainable agriculture and long-term ecological and economic benefits.


Assam

1. Improvement & Widening of the road from Chaygaon to Ukium, a 22.20 Km project under NESIDS (Roads)

Assam has seen substantial financial releases and project completions in its transport infrastructure. Approximately ₹11.78 Crore has been released for the Improvement & Widening of the road from Chaygaon to Ukium, a 22.20 Km project under NESIDS (Roads) that benefits 15 villages and a population of 50,000.

Additionally, a major infrastructure development was marked by the completion of the RCC Bridge No. 3/1 over River Dikhow at Chiripuria Ghat, along with the connecting road from Chiripuria via Ajanpeer Dorgah road to NH 37.

This project, with a span of 159.68 meters for the bridge and a road length of 0.16 Km, was completed at a cost of approximately ₹17.99 Crore. It serves as a direct communication link between Amguri and Sivasagar Constituency, significantly alleviating the socio-economic challenges for the poor residents of 20 villages and a substantial population 700,000, of effectively integrating them into the mainstream society.



Construction of RCC Bridge No. 3/1 over River Dikhow Chirpuria Ghat along with road from Chiripiria via Ajanpeer Dorgah road to NH 37(Span 159.68 m) in Assam.

Additionally, an inspection was carried out on June, 2025, for the road from NH-515 at Lakhi Nepali to Junakareng via Raying Army Camp, an important 14.08 Km route under NESIDS (Roads) with a project cost of approximately ₹66.84 Crore, benefiting 50 villages and 50,000 people.

2. Anti-Erosion Measures at different reaches on both bank of river Pomra, Baksa district, Assam.

This project, titled "Anti-Erosion Measures at different reaches on both bank of river Pomra (Assam), Baksa district," was sanctioned with an approved cost of ₹2.2794 crore. The primary objective was to implement robust anti-erosion measures through the construction of continuous bank revetments with aprons at identified affected reaches, along with other necessary allied works.




Location :- At Rajabil Village (Ch.465.00m to Ch.600.00m)

The main component of the scheme involved boulder revetment in cages along the slope and a cage apron, extending for a length of 798.00 meters. These works were strategically located at different reaches of Rajabil and Paulbasti villages. Upon its completion on August 7, 2025, the project has successfully protected the entire location against erosion and reclaimed eroded areas. This has led to significant positive impacts, including:

- The creation of horticulture gardens and agricultural land, fostering economic development among villagers.
- The protection of public and private properties, such as road communications, school premises, houses, and household belongings.

Overall, the scheme has greatly benefited a population of 10,000 individuals and secured a

total benefited area of 1,000 hectares.





Manipur

1. The upgradation of Moirang Sendra Road upto Sendra Hillock and Road from Moirang Sendra Road to Omba Hillock and Keina Bazar on Moirang Khunou to Thanga Keibul Road (length 4.30 Km) has been completed under NESIDS (Roads). The project, costing ₹20.32 Crore, benefits 7 villages and a population of 9,700.







This road project is critically important for promoting Tourism, anticipating an increase in domestic and foreign tourists from 2,00,000 to 3,00,000 per year. It aims to improve road networks, boost infrastructure for accessibility, attract more tourists, and stimulate economic activities, particularly creating job opportunities in the agrarian sector.

Meghalaya

1. Setting up of Bio-Curcumin Extraction Unit at Lashkein Block, West Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya

The project, titled "Setting up of Bio-Curcumin Extraction Unit at Lashkein Block, West Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya", with an amount of Rs. 1.50 crore under schemes of NEC has completed on 08th July, 2025. The project will provide sustainable livelihood and income opportunities to lakadong turmeric farmers of West Jaintia Hills by targeting to meet the demand for value added product of Lakadong Turmeric in the domestic market and seeking to tap the export potential as well.

To establish a plant for conversion of 200 kgs dry turmeric per day to oleoresin, powder, curcumin and biocurcumin capsule. The project has created direct employment for 12 persons who are working in the Factory regularly. A total of 15 Collective Marketing Centres (CMC) have been aggregated having 600 members in total and supply raw/slice Lakadong Turmeric the Processing to Centre. Lakadong Trumeric Farmers annual income hav increased from Rs. 50000/- to Rs. 60000/- annually in the last two years. Annually more than 100MT of Raw Lakadong Turmeric has been processed as slice, powdered and oleoresin extraction.

Mizoram

1.Improvement/Up-gradation of Operational/ Non-Operational facilities of Lengpui Airport (SH: Elevated road with connected components" under NESIDS (Roads) in the State of Mizoram.

The Improvement/Up-gradation of Operational/ Non-Operational facilities of Lengpui Airport (SH: Elevated road with connected components) under NESIDS has been completed. The project, with a Cost of ₹ 19.59 Crore, benefitted 3,282 villages. Lengpui Airport has been operational for over 20 years, and with increasing flight requirements, this project is anticipated to facilitate and enhance opportunities for potential growth in air connectivity, proving highly beneficial for the people of Mizoram and contributing significantly to the socioeconomic upliftment of the state.





2. Improvement & Up gradation of Hnahlan-Hmunhlui-Tuimang-Singngei Road (Hnahlan to River Tiau: Mizoram Area, Length-12.00 Km) under NESIDS (Roads) in the State of Mizoram

The Improvement & Up gradation of Hnahlan-Hmunhlui-Tuimang-Singngei Road (Hnahlan to River Tiau: Mižoram Ārea) has also been completed under NESIDS. This road has a length of 12 Km and a Project Cost of ₹ 44.17 Crore, benefiting 8 villages population of 150,631. improvement will enhance the functioning of government machinery in addressing critical issues like infiltration, smuggling of arms, ammunition, drugs, and fake Indian currency notes along the Indo-Myanmar Border within Mizoram. It is vital for improving socio-economic development in the border area due to its remoteness and promoting border trade employment generation. This road will connect strategic points along the international border.



3. Development of Backward Lai Community, Lawngtali District, Mizoram

project, titled "Development Backward Lai Community, Lawngtali District, Mizoram", with an amount of Rs 4.79 crore has completed on March, 2025. The project includes (A) Construction of Rural House (Building Portion): To provide Housing facilities to low income rural or urban dwellers. (B) Construction of LAHASH hostel: Due to unavailable of hostel many students from rural area could not pursue their higher studies. In view of the problem being faced by the student's construction of hostel is felt significant. (C) Livelihood Development: Under this sector, there are: Piggery Development, Goatery Development, Fishery Development, Floriculture Development: The objective of the sector is to generate income as well as generation of adequate supply of fresh flower, meat in an outside the district. (D) Sports infrastructure: In order to develop the players' skill and also impart a systematic and organised training module among the players of younger generation. (E) Cold Storage building: With the installation of cold storage facility, the farmers and near the villages will be able to store farm product like fruits, vegetable etc for long period.

4. Community Development Programme for Bru & Chakmas in Mamit District, C&RD Block, West Phaileng, Mizoram

"Community project, titled Development Programme for Bru Chakmas in Mamit District, C&RD Block, West Phaileng, Mizoram", with an amount of Rs 1.55 crore has completed on March, 2025. The Objective of the Community Development Programme for Bru &Chakma's empower the minor to community members by enhancing their skills knowledge and confidence and also enable them to participate actively in decision-making process. То strengthen local institution and organisation to promote economic growth and ensure that marginalized and vulnerable groups have access to resources, opportunities and service. To also provide education opportunitiesthat enhances literacy, vocational skill and lifelong learning for all community members.

In addition, Mizoram has completed following projects aimed at community empowerment, adventure tourism, cultural promotion, and historical preservation:

1. Workshop on Community Based Tourism (CBT) Development at Aizawl, Langlei, and Saiha

With a project cost of ₹9.00 lakh, this workshop has completed on 14th August 2025. The initiative aims to empower and enable local communities to actively engage in tourism enterprises. It seeks to enhance income opportunities for diverse local groups including entrepreneurs, NGOs, youth clubs, women's self-help groups, artisans, farmers, musicians, and cultural clubs. The project also intends to increase the competitiveness of Mizoram's tourism market by offering unique and authentic local experiences, while identifying, promoting, and developing tourism products and services that are integrated into the value chain, ensuring benefits remain within the community.

2. Tour de Hmuifang 2024, Aizawl

This project, with a cost of ₹10.00 lakh and marked its completion on 14th August 2025, aimed to organize a high-quality cross-country marathon (XCM) race to attract both professional and amateur cyclists. It seeks to promote adventure tourism by showcasing the region's potential for outdoor sports and recreational activities. The project further focuses on enhancing physical fitness, encouraging participation across all levels, fostering community engagement, generating economic benefits, and facilitating cultural exchange. It emphasizes environmental sustainability through eco-friendly practices while also promoting cycling as a sport and leisure activity.













4. Champhai Hnahnsin Kut (COSMOS FESTIVAL), Champhai

Scheduled for completion on 18th August 2025, this festival is envisaged as a platform to showcase and market Champhai's tourist attractions. It aims to promote and develop tourism within Champhai district while generating livelihood opportunities for local communities. The initiative also seeks to enhance Mizoram's tourism competitiveness by meeting the diverse needs of visitors. It is expected to benefit local entrepreneurs, florists, farmers, winemakers, artisans, handloom and handicraft workers, artists, and musicians by providing them with venues for display and sales. The festival will include a range of activities such as flower exhibitions, cycle rallies, paragliding, cosplay events, and musical evenings, thereby promoting tourism and highlighting the district's cultural and natural beauty.













5. The project titled "Chapchar-Kut cum G-20 Summit 2023 in Mizoram" was successfully completed with the financial support of the North Eastern Council (NEC). The project was completed on the date of September 10, 2025. The total expenditure incurred amounted to ₹1.25 crore.













The primary objective of this initiative was to project the Chapchar-Kut festival onto an international platform. In doing so, the project sought to rediscover the cultural heritage of Mizoram, encourage and nurture traditional practices of Mizo life, and create awareness among the younger generation about the significance of safeguarding heritage. By blending cultural celebration with the global context of the G-20 Summit, project successfully positioned the Mizoram's traditions before wider audience.

The outcomes of the project were manifold. It significantly enhanced cultural pride among the people of Mizoram and instilled a renewed sense of unity. The event also generated momentum for tourism development, attracting national and international attention. Local artisans, performers, cultural practitioners and benefitted greatly from the platform

provided, as it enabled them to showcase

their craft and gain recognition. Importantly, the festival also created space for dialogue between the past and the present, allowing younger generations to connect with their heritage in meaningful ways.

The financial support of the NEC was instrumental in realizing these achievements. By enabling the successful organization of the event, the Council played a key role in preserving intangible cultural heritage while simultaneously fostering growth in local economies. The Chapchar-Kut cum G-20 Summit 2023 in Mizoram thus stands as a notable example cultural promotion, heritage preservation, and tourism development can be effectively integrated with broader developmental goals.

In conclusion, the project has left a lasting impact by elevating the visibility of Mizoram's cultural identity on the global stage. The NEC's support ensured that the festival not only preserved the traditions of

the past but also contributed to economic sustainability and youth engagement, thereby reinforcing the significance of cultural heritage in the state's development journey.

2. In addition, two substantial infrastructure proposals for identified blocks in Lawngtlai district, Mizoram—Chawngte Block and Bungtlang South Block—were completed on 10th September 2025. These projects shared the primary objective of enhancing overall development, improving health and educational infrastructure, and imparting essential skills and technical know-how for employment generation. The combined approved funding for these two initiatives is Rs 938.00 lakh.

The first completed project was the Proposal of identified block for providing key identified service at Chawngte Block, Lawngtlai district, Mizoram, which had an approved amount of Rs 455.00 lakh. The main goal was to improve the socioeconomic condition of the people by enhancing overall income and improving health and educational infrastructure. The resulting infrastructure, specifically the construction of schools and Anganwadi centres, led to increased access to education and enhanced healthcare. This project successfully transformed rural communities and benefited over a thousand beneficiaries, including children, women, and families.

second completed project, The Proposal of identified block for providing key identified service at Bungtlang South Block, Lawngtlai district, Mizoram, was approved for Rs 483.00 lakh. This initiative also focused on improving socio-economic conditions by enhancing overall income and This proposal educational services. successfully constructed school buildings, Anganwadi centres, and harvesting tanks. These infrastructure projects significantly enhanced access to quality education, reliable healthcare, and clean ultimately transforming the lives of rural communities and promoting sustainable livelihoods.

Nagaland

1. Dikhu Bridge to Amguri road project, spanning 17.155 Km in Mokokchung District, Nagaland

A significant milestone was reached with the completion of the Dikhu Bridge to Amguri road project, spanning 17.155 Km in Mokokchung District. Completed under NESIDS (Roads) with a project cost of approximately ₹59.77 Crore, this road connects Naksen with NH-2 and is vital for improving internal connectivity between western and eastern districts of Nagaland with Mokokchung, fostering socioeconomic development, and aiding security and defence agencies in border areas. This completed project serves four villages and a population of 13,340.





2. Establishment of Chicken Rearing Farm & Satellite Farms at Siethekema-C, Dimapur titled "Establishment of project, Chicken Rearing Farm & Satellite Farms at Siethekema-C, Dimapur, Nagaland ", with an amount of Rs. 3.26 crore under schemes of NEC has completed on 21st July, 2025. The project will increase productivity of meat particularly Chicken in the state with a view to reduce the gap of meat import into the State. Thereby, prevent drainage of State exchequer, Enhance production of quality LIT birds, so as to make it readily available at affordable prices for the poultry farmers and Create employment avenues & income generation, which at present the State is facing employment problem.

Benefits derived from the Project include – Increase availability of Low Input Technology (LIT) Birds in the State of an affordable rate (i.e. 7000 LIT Birds per cycle/batch), Enhance meat production in the State [16 tonnes of meat (chicken) per cycle, Cretion of employment opportunities (6 nos of skilled labour & 15 nos of unskilled labour).

3. Proposal of identified block for providing key identified service at Lotsu village, Wokha Block, Mon district, Nagaland

The project, titled "Proposal of identified block for providing key identified service at Lotsu village, Wokha Block, Mon district, Nagaland", with an amount of Rs. 1.96 crore under schemes of NEC has completed on 16th July, 2025. and training for growth and development of the block and For ensuring the economic activity to have a beneficial relationship the location to further develop the economy of



The project will make the block areas more productive and less vulnerable to natural hazards and produce beneficial relationship with the regional and national economy, Put into place some key infrastructure development in Sanis block, Provide holistic development to the people especially the youth under Sanis Block, Development of the block and make itself sustaining through mass participation, Ensure local autonomy and disruption of traditional customs, Promotes sustainable development by providing protection to environment and Organization of capacity building programs and training for growth and development of the block.

In addition, Nagaland has completed following projects aimed at enhancing accommodation, promoting sericulture, supporting festivals, and developing amenity centers:

1. Construction of Guest House at Longleng District Head Quarter, Longleng The North Eastern Council has undertaken the construction of a guest house at Longleng District Head Quarter with a project cost of Rs. 316 lakhs, which was

completed on 8th August 2025. The project aims to provide temporary and convenient accommodation to travelers, tourists, and guests while creating a cozy, home-like atmosphere in a safe and secure environment. Additionally, the guest house supports local businesses, initiatives, and community activities, thereby contributing to the local economy.



The Executive Engineer, PWD (Housing) Division, Government Tuensang Nagaland, serves as the implementing agency and ensures 24/7 service through its comprehensive organizational structure. The facility is managed by a General Manager and includes specialized departments such as the Front Desk, Housekeeping Department, Technical Support and Maintenance Department, and Security and Safety Department. The guest provides more affordable house accommodation options compared to hotels while maintaining a cozy ambience with all necessary facilities, ultimately generating revenue for the organization.

2. Seri – Tourism Model Farming Centre, in Mokokchung, Dimapur and Phek

The Seri - Tourism Model Farming Centre project has been established in Mokokchung, Dimapur, and Phek districts with a total project cost of Rs. 487 lakhs and was completed on 7th August 2025. The primary objective of this initiative is to uphold silk production in the region while disseminating the latest technology to local farmers and producers. The centre aims to attract at least 1,000 foreign tourists and

50,000 domestic tourists annually, offering them a unique opportunity to experience the traditional Muga silk production process firsthand.













3. Tourism Information Centre and Tourist Guide Management for the 25th Hornbill Festival 2024

A specialized Tourism Information Centre and Tourist Guide Management system was established for the 25th Hornbill Festival 2024 with a budget allocation of Rs. 20 lakhs, completed on 11th August 2025. The project ensures the smooth execution of the Hornbill Festival 2025 by providing accurate and detailed information to visitors throughout the event. The initiative includes comprehensive training programs for local guides to achieve minimum proficiency standards, enabling them to better serve tourists.



The centre provides tour operators with valuable opportunities to interact directly with visitors and showcase their products and services. Furthermore, the project enables local community members to generate alternate sources of revenue through tourism-related activities during the festival period.

4. Tourist Amenity Centre at Dzu River, District Kohima

The Tourist Amenity Centre at Dzu River in Kohima District represents a significant investment in tourism infrastructure with a project cost of Rs. 484 lakhs, completed on 11th August 2025. The facility aims to promote tourism activities while meeting the growing demand for quality hospitality services in the region. The project focuses on generating employment opportunities for local youth and creating sustainable revenue streams for the community.

The Technical wing, headed by the Executive Engineer (NPWD) under the Directorate of Tourism, Kohima, successfully oversaw all construction work for this comprehensive facility.

The centre prioritizes local community engagement by outsourcing raw material supply and services from nearby residents and businesses.

The Tourist Amenity Centre offers excellent prospects for various tourism activities while generating significant employment opportunities and increasing farmers' income through direct sourcing of goods from local farms. The facility features a fully operational restaurant that serves both local Naga cuisine and popular Indian dishes, complemented by a commissioned dining hall and a separate kitchen facility, all of which are currently operational and serving visitors.

5. Rutsa Multipurpose Irrigation Project Completed in Kohima District, Nagaland

The Rutsa Multipurpose Irrigation Project in Nagaland, Kohima District, been has successfully completed, marking significant step towards enhancing agricultural productivity and improving the livelihood of local farming communities. The project was sanctioned with an original approved amount of ₹700.00 lakhs on 23rd March 2016, later revised to ₹694.85 lakhs on 16th September 2020.

The project aims to ensure a regulated and timely supply of water to the fields of small and marginal farmers, thereby enabling the cultivation of multiple high-yielding crop varieties through modern agricultural practices. It is designed to generate self-employment opportunities for both skilled and unskilled workers while also providing drinking water to nearby villages.

With the development of an assured irrigation facility, the project is expected to significantly increase agricultural production and productivity, contributing to the overall socio-economic improvement of the beneficiary communities. The availability of a permanent water source will enhance crop returns, encourage vegetative growth, and help reduce the practice of shifting (Jhum) cultivation in the catchment areas. Additionally, the project will help minimize riverbank erosion, reduce flooding, and promote eco-tourism in the region.

The Rutsa Multipurpose Irrigation Project will directly benefit around 320 households from T-Khel and Jotsoma villages. Covering a Gross Command Area of 350 hectares with a Culturable Command Area of 230 hectares, the project includes a 1.65 km main channel providing irrigation to approximately 130 hectares of farmland.

The successful completion of this project represents a crucial step in strengthening agricultural infrastructure and promoting sustainable rural development in Nagaland.

Sikkim

The project seeks to transform village life into a self-sufficient corporation while promoting a pollution-free environment and nature preservation.






Tripura
