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Union Minister Jyotiraditya M. Scindia Launches NERACE: A Digital Revolution for North East Agriculture

Marking a significant advancement for agricultural trade in the Northeast, Union Minister for the Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) and Communications, Jyotiraditya M. Scindia, launched the North East Region Agri-Commodity e-Connect (NERACE) web portal and mobile app at the North Eastern Council (NEC) headquarters in Shillong on July 12, 2024. This pioneering platform is designed to link local farmers with buyers both domestically and internationally, set to transform the region's agricultural landscape. Developed by the North Eastern Development Finance Corporation (NEDFi) with funding from the NEC, NERACE aims to connect 50,000 farmers with 5,000 buyers over the next five years. Guided by the vision of 'Vocal for Local, then Global,' NERACE is positioned to foster agricultural growth and prosperity across the region.

Highlighting the significance of NERACE web portal and app, the Minister said, "The dream of a self reliant India-Atmanirbhar Bharat and a Viksit Bharat can only be realised when we have Atmanirbhar Northeast and a Viksit Northeast and when you talk about an Atmanirbhar Northeast and a Viksit Northeast that reality is wholly and solely dependent on a Viksit and Atmanirbhar Annadata - the farmers of the Northeast and I do really believe that if you look at the protagonist of the new emergence self-reliant India, farmers have to be at the forefront of that monumental change. Through the NERACE app, my farmers and my Annadata in the Northeast will be not only be connected to the market interstate, intra Northeast, and intra India but will be connected to the world. And this app will be able to accentuate the ability of my Annadata to reach the globe and will connect three important stakeholders - the producers, the buyers and the service providers; it will also install a sense of pride in the agricultural community."

Empowering the Farming Community

NERACE is designed to support a diverse range of agricultural and horticultural products, including spices, fruits, vegetables, pulses, cereals, and minor forest produce. By providing farmers with better market access, improved negotiation opportunities, and real-time availability updates, the app aims to enhance their ability to secure premium pricing and establish direct relationships with buyers. Buyers, in turn, will gain access to verified sellers and high-quality products, along with streamlined transaction and logistics support.

The Minister said that NE-RACE will play a pivotal role in positioning the North-East as a hub of high value horticultural products. It will make the farmers of the region not just the producers but also as a reliable partner in the international agri value chain, he added.

The platform supports multiple languages including English, Hindi, Assamese, Mizo, Manipuri, Nepali, and Khasi, making it accessible to a wide range of users in the region. By offering a unified digital space for producers, buyers, and service providers, NERACE is set to position the Northeast as a hub of high-value horticultural products, integrating local farmers into the international agri-value chain.

A Vision for the North East

During his visit, Shri Scindia also chaired a review meeting of ongoing schemes and projects. A key highlight was the presentation of the first draft of the NER Vision 2047 by Shri Angshuman Dey, Secretary of NEC, with insights from Professor Mahendra Lama, Chairman of the Drafting Committee, NER Vision 2047. The vision document outlines ambitious goals for the region, including establishing it as a South Asian power hub, leveraging border areas, promoting green initiatives, and becoming a center for climate studies and tourism.

A two-day workshop on capacity building focused on the portals of the Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER) was held at the North Eastern Council (NEC) Secretariat from September on 12 and 13 September 2024. The workshop aimed to sensitize the staff of various NE State Governments including North Eastern Council Secretariat (NECS) about the IT systems developed by MDoNER.

The workshop was attended by senior officers from MDoNER, the National Informatics Centre (NIC), and various stakeholders from the Planning Departments of state governments, FTSUs, NICSI, NEDFi, NERCORMS, BISAG-N, NEC, and MDoNER. This diverse participation underscored the collaborative efforts towards leveraging technology for development in the North Eastern region.



The primary objectives of the workshop included:

- Capacity building regarding the Poorvottar Sampark Setu Portal, Poorvottar Vikas Setu Portal, and Analytics Dashboard, along with the SAMBHAV initiative, which is currently under development.
- Optimizing the use of these IT systems to enhance their capabilities based on field-level experiences.
- Encouraging state governments to utilize the tools provided by MDoNER for improved project management.

On September 20, 2024, Dr. Sukanta Majumdar, the Hon'ble Minister of State for Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER) and Education, inaugurated the Centre for Brahmaputra Studies at Gauhati University. This initiative is set to play a crucial role in promoting sustainable development and research concerning the vital Brahmaputra River, spanning over 2,900 kilometers, is not just a geographical feature; it is the very heart of this region, deeply embedded in its environment, culture, and the livelihoods of millions.

During his visit, Dr. Majumdar articulated that the Centre embodies the government's vision for holistic and sustainable development in the North East, driven by innovation. The Centre aims to be a hub for multidisciplinary research, policy-making, and knowledge-sharing. Vision and Objectives of the Centre are

The Centre for Brahmaputra Studies will be a "one-stop destination" for all research, policy, and knowledge concerning the river.

- It will serve as a critical resource for policymakers, academicians, and society at large.
- The Centre's primary mission is to provide insights and solutions that guide the sustainable development of the region and ensure the well-being of the people who rely on the Brahmaputra.

Some key objectives include:

- Conducting multidisciplinary research on the river's flow networks and environmental dynamics.
- Studying the relationship between the land, river, and the people who depend on it.
- Establishing a comprehensive data repository that will become an invaluable resource for future research and policymaking.
- Collaborating with national and international organizations to develop policies that address challenges like floods, erosion, and hydrological changes.

Capacity Building and Innovation:

- The Centre will also focus on capacity building by organizing training programs, workshops, and short-term courses to equip students, researchers, and policymakers with the knowledge needed to tackle the challenges surrounding the Brahmaputra.
- In addition, the Centre will foster public awareness about the importance of the Brahmaputra and set up an innovation hub to develop solutions for key challenges like water management, energy, and environmental sustainability.

International Collaboration:

- This Centre will include contributions from some of the most renowned international scholars, bringing in global best practices to find solutions for the North Eastern Region's unique challenges.
- This exchange of knowledge will place Gauhati University on the global map, enhancing its standing as a leading research institution.

Supported by the North Eastern Council (NEC) with a funding allocation of ₹28 crores, the Centre is poised to gain international recognition as a vital institution addressing the complex challenges posed by the Brahmaputra River.

The inauguration event was attended by prominent figures including Prof. Nani Gopal Mahanta, Vice Chancellor of Gauhati University, Shri Angshuman Dey, Joint Secretary of the Ministry of DoNER, and Ms. Sherry Lalthangzo, Economic Adviser at NEC, alongside faculty members, students, and other distinguished guests.

He acknowledged the financial backing from NEC, which facilitated the Centre's establishment.

Concluding his address, Dr. Majumdar reaffirmed the government's commitment to the holistic development of the North East and urged Gauhati University to expedite the recruitment of key personnel to ensure the Centre becomes fully operational as soon as possible.

The Centre occupies an impressive 8,000 square meters, equipped with state-of-the-art research facilities, laboratories, and administrative spaces, reflecting a strong commitment to interdisciplinary research on the Brahmaputra's ecological, socio-economic, and cultural aspects.

Prof. Nani Gopal Mahanta extended gratitude to the Ministry of DoNER and NEC for their support, assuring attendees that the Centre for Brahmaputra Studies is destined to become a leading global research hub, making significant contributions to the region's development.

This inauguration signifies not only a commitment to academic excellence but also a proactive approach to addressing the environmental and socio-economic challenges faced by the North Eastern Region, fostering a sustainable future for its communities.

Earlier Minister of State for Education and Development of the North East Region, Dr. Sukanta Majumdar Inaugurated Central Animal and In Vitro Drug Testing Facilities at National Institute of Pharmaceutical Education and Research (NIPER), Guwahati, the first national pharma institute in Northeast India. Sponsored by the North Eastern Council under the aegis of Ministry of DoNER, these facilities were funded under the Science & Technology Intervention in North Eastern Region (STINER) programme.

"This project aligns with the visionary leadership of Hon'ble PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji, transforming Northeast India into a beacon of development and innovation," Dr. Majumdar stated. The facilities, with an investment of ₹20 crore, will advance research on herbal medicines from indigenous plants.

एकता की भाषा है राजभाषा हिंदी

मानव जाति अपने सृजन से ही स्वयं को अभिव्यक्त करने के तरह-तरह के माध्यम खोजती रही है। आपसी संकेतों के सहारे एक-दूसरे को समझने के ये प्रयास जब अभिव्यक्ति के सर्वोच्च शिखर पर जब पहुँचे तो भाषा का विकास संभव हुआ। भाषा लोगों को आपस में जोड़ने का सबसे सरल और ज़रूरी माध्यम है।

भाषा वह साधन है, जिसके द्वारा मनुष्य बोलकर, सुनकर, लिखकर और पढ़कर अपने मन के भावों या विचारों का आदान-प्रदान करता है। दूसरे शब्दों में- जिसके द्वारा हम अपने भावों को लिखित अथवा कथित रूप से दूसरों को समझा सकें और दूसरों के भावों को समझ सकें, उसे भाषा कहते है। सार्थक शब्दों के समूह या संकेत को हम भाषा कहते हैं।

राजभाषा हिन्दी एकता, भावना और प्रेम की भाषा है। राजभाषा हिन्दी ने सभी जन आंदोलनों में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई है। भाषा किसी भी देश की धार्मिक, सामाजिक, सांस्कृतिक तथा दार्शनिक परिस्थित को जानने का सथक्त माध्यम होती है। भारत में हिन्दी समस्त जनमानस की संवदेनाओं को प्रकट करने का सरल माध्यम है। देश में हिंदी दिवस हर साल 14 सितंबर को मनाया जाता है।

प्रश्न उठता है कि हिंदी दिवस हर साल 14 सितंबर को ही क्यों मनाया जाता है? दरअसल इसी दिन संविधान सभा ने वर्ष 1949 में हिंदी को राजभाषा के रूप में अपनाया था। वर्ष 1953 में राष्ट्रभाषा प्रचार समिति वर्धा ने 14 सितंबर को हिंदी दिवस के रूप में मनाए जाने का प्रस्ताव दिया, तब से ये दिन हिंदी दिवस के रूप में मनाया जाने लगा।

एक भाषा के रूप में अगर हिंदी भाषा की विकास यात्रा की चर्चा करें तो यह एक लंबी और सतत प्रक्रिया है। एक भाषा के विकास में उस समाज और संस्कृति की महत्त्वपूर्ण भूमिका होती है, जहाँ पर ये बोली जाती है। हिंदी भाषा के विकास में भी समाज और संस्कृति की महत्त्वपूर्ण भूमिका रही है; ख़ासकर उत्तर भारतीय राज्यों की भूमिका। संस्कृत भारत की प्राचीनतम भाषा है और इसी भाषा के विभिन्न काल खंडों में अलग-अलग स्वरूपों में हुए वियोजन से हिंदी का विकास हुआ है।

संस्कृत भाषा से पालि, पालि से प्राकृत, प्राकृत से अपभ्रंश, अपभ्रंश से अवहट्ट, अवहट्ट से पुरानी हिंदी और पुरानी हिंदी से उस आधुनिक हिंदी का विकास हुआ, जिसे आज हम बोलते है। हालांकि इसे लेकर मतभेद है कि अपभ्रंश से हिंदी का विकास हुआ है या पुरानी हिंदी से। मगर वर्तमान भाषा विज्ञानी इसे अपभ्रंश से ही विकसित हुआ मानते है।

अगर हिंदी भाषा के विकास के कालखंड की बात करें तो इसे तीन कालों में विभक्त किया जा सकता है-पहला कालखंड 1100 ईस्वी-1350 ईस्वी का माना जाता है, इसे प्राचीन हिंदी का काल कहा जाता है। दूसरा कालखंड मध्य काल (1350 ईस्वी-1850 ईस्वी) कहा जाता है। इस काल में हिंदी भाषा की बोलियों अवधी और ब्रज में विपुल साहित्य रचा गया। तीसरा कालखंड 1850 ईस्वी से अब तक माना जाता है और इसे आधुनिक काल की संज्ञा दी जाती है। इस काल में हिंदी भाषा का स्वरूप बेहद तेजी से बदला है।

दरअसल इस काल में हिंदी जन-जन की भाषा बन गई। ये वो दौर था, जब आज़ादी की लड़ाई लड़ी जा रही थी और इस दौरान हिंदी का संपर्क भाषा के रूप में प्रचलन खूब बढ़ा। यह हिंदी भाषा का ही असर था कि उत्तर भारत ही नहीं दक्षिण भारत से भी आने वाले आजादी के नायकों ने इसे राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में स्वीकार किये जाने की पुरज़ोर वकालत की।

यदि राष्ट्रभाषा और राजभाषा के अंतर की बात की जाए तो इनमें दो प्रमुख अंतर हैं। एक अंतर इन्हें बोलने वालों की संख्या से है और दूसरा अंतर इनके प्रयोग का है। राष्ट्रभाषा जहाँ जनसाधारण की भाषा होती है और लोग इससे भावात्मक और सांस्कृतिक रूप से जुड़े होते हैं तो वहीं राजभाषा का सीमित प्रयोग होता है। राजभाषा का प्रयोग अक्सर सरकारी कार्यालयों और सरकारी कार्मिकों द्वारा किया जाता है। कुछ देशों, जैसे ब्रिटेन की इंग्लिश, जर्मनी की जर्मन और पाकिस्तान की उर्दू; की राष्ट्रभाषा और राजभाषा एक ही हैं। मगर बहुभाषी देशों के साथ यह समस्या है। यहाँ राष्ट्रभाषा और राजभाषा अलग-अलग होती है।

राष्ट्रभाषा किसी देश को एक करने के लिहाज से बेहद महत्त्वपूर्ण होती है। यही कारण है कि महात्मा गांधी ने वर्ष 1917 में गुजरात के भरूच में हुए गुजरात शैक्षिक सम्मेलन में हिंदी भाषा को राष्ट्रभाषा बनाए जाने की वकालत की थी-"भारतीय भाषाओं में केवल हिंदी ही एक ऐसी भाषा है जिसे राष्ट्रभाषा के रूप में अपनाया जा सकता है क्योंकि यह अधिकांश भारतीयों द्वारा बोली जाती है; यह समस्त भारत में आर्थिक, धार्मिक और राजनीतिक सम्पर्क माध्यम के रूप में प्रयोग के लिए सक्षम है तथा इसे सारे देश के लिए सीखना आवश्यक है।"

आज़ादी के बाद हिन्दी और अंग्रेज़ी को राजभाषा के रूप में स्वीकार किया गया। शुरुआत में यह प्रावधान 15 वर्षों के लिए ही किया गया था। संसद को यह शिक्त दी गई थी कि अगर वह चाहे तो देश की ज़रुरत को महेनज़र रखते हुए अंग्रेज़ी भाषा के प्रयोग की अवधि को बढ़ा सकती है। वर्ष 1963 में राजभाषा अधिनियम पारित किया गया। वर्ष 1967 में इसे संशोधित किया गया। सरकार ने सभी पक्षों की माँग को ध्यान में रखते हुए त्रिभाषा फार्मूला बनाया। इसके अंतर्गत पहली भाषा मातृभाषा होगी जिसमें प्रारंभिक शिक्षा दी जाएगी। दूसरी भाषा ग़ैर हिन्दी भाषियों के लिए हिंदी और हिंदी भाषियों के लिए आठवीं अनुसूची में शामिल कोई भी भाषा होगी। तीसरी भाषा अंतरिष्ट्रीय भाषा यानी अंग्रेज़ी होगी ताकि शिक्षित भारतीय शेष विश्व से भी आसानी से जुड़ सकें।

इसी कड़ी को आगे बढ़ाते हुए सन् 1976 में राजभाषा अधिनियम लाया गया और इसके अंतर्गत राजभाषा विभाग की स्थापना की गई। यह विभाग ही हिंदी के प्रचार-प्रसार से संबंधित विभिन्न समारोहों जैसे हिंदी दिवस, हिंदी पखवाड़ा और हिंदी सप्ताह का आयोजन करता है। इसी के तत्त्वाधान में 10 जनवरी को विश्व हिंदी दिवस भी मनाया जाता है।

अगर हिंदी भाषा की संवैधानिक स्थिति की बात की जाए तो यह राजभाषा के रूप में संविधान के भाग 5, भाग 6, भाग 17 में समाविष्ट है। भाग 17 में राजभाषा शीर्षक के अंतर्गत 4 अध्याय है। इसमें संघ शासन, प्रादेशिक शासन, उच्चतम और उच्च न्यायालयों में इस्तेमाल की जाने वाली भाषा के संबंध में विशेष निर्देश दिए गए हैं। भाग 5 के अनुच्छेद 120 में बताया गया है कि संसदीय कामकाज की भाषा हिंदी और अंग्रेज़ी होगी। यदि किन्हीं सदस्यों को इन्हें बोलने में परेशानी आती हैं तो वो अध्यक्ष की अनुमति लेकर अपनी भाषा में बात कह सकते हैं। भाग 6 के अंतर्गत अनुच्छेद 210 में राज्य विधानमंडल के लिए भी ऐसे प्रावधान हैं।

अगर हिंदी भाषा की वैश्विक स्थिति की बात की जाए तो यह विश्व के 150 से अधिक देशों में फैले दो करोड़ भारतीयों द्वारा बोली जाती है। इसके अलावा 40 देशों के 600 से अधिक विश्वविद्यालयों और स्कूलों में हिंदी पढाई जाती है। एक सर्वेक्षण के मुताबिक विश्व की सबसे अधिक बोली जाने वाली भाषा मंदारिन है तो दूसरा स्थान हिंदी भाषा का है। इसके अलावा हिन्दी भारत और फिजी की राजभाषा है। ब्रिटिश भारत काल के दौरान बहुत से श्रमिकों को भारत से बाहर ले जाया गया था। इनमें से अधिकांश देशों में हिंदी भाषा आज एक क्षेत्रीय भाषा है; ये देश है- मॉरीशस, सूरीनाम, त्रिनिनाद, गुयाना आदि। हिन्दी के महत्व को रेखांकित करते हुए मॉरीशस में विश्व हिंदी सचिवालय की स्थापना की गई है। हालांकि हिंदी को अभी भी संयुक्त राष्ट्र की आधिकारिक भाषा का दर्जा नहीं मिल सका है।

अगर हिंदी भाषा की एक भाषा के तौर पर सामयिक स्थिति का विश्लेषण किया जाए तो इसके समक्ष अनेक चुनौतियाँ हैं। सबसे बड़ी चुनौती तो इसे 'राष्ट्रभाषा की स्वीकार्यता' का न मिल पाना है। इसके अलावा एक उच्च शिक्षित अभिजात्य वर्ग ऐसा भी है जो हिंदी बोलने में शर्म और हिचकिचाहर महसूस करता है। हिंदी भारत की सार्वभौमिक संवाद भाषा भी नहीं है। वर्ष 2011 की जनगणना के अनुसार भारत की 41 फ़ीसदी आबादी की ही मातृभाषा हिंदी है। इसके अलावा लगभग 75 प्रतिशत भारतीयों की दूसरी भाषा हिंदी है जो इसे बोल और समझ सकते हैं।

हिंदी भाषा के सामने एक प्रमुख चुनौती यह है कि यह अब तक रोज़गार की भाषा नहीं बन पाई है। आज तमाम मल्टीनेशनल कंपनियों के दैनिक कामकाज से लेकर कार्य संचालन की भाषा अंग्रेज़ी है। इसके अलावा तमाम क्षेत्रीय राजनीतिक और सामाजिक संगठन भी अपने निहित स्वार्थों के लिए हिंदी का विरोध करते हैं। अभी भी भारत में उच्च शिक्षा और तकनीकी शिक्षा का माध्यम ज्यादातर अंग्रेज़ी ही रहता है। हिंदी भाषा की हालत आज ऐसी है कि इसके संबंध में जागरुकता सृजन के लिए विभिन्न सेमिनारों, समारोहों और कार्यक्रमों का सहारा लेना पडता है।

हालांकि इंटरनेट के बढ़ते इस्तेमाल ने हिंदी भाषा के भविष्य के संबंध में भी नई राहें दिखाई हैं। गूगल के अनुसार भारत में अंग्रेज़ी भाषा में जहाँ विषयवस्तु निर्माण की रफ्तार १९ फ़ीसदी है, वहीं हिंदी के लिए ये आंकड़ा ९४ प्रतिशत है। इसलिए हिंदी को नई सूचना-प्रौद्योगिकी की जरुरतों के मुताबिक ढाला जाए तो ये इस भाषा के विकास में बेहद उपयोगी सिद्ध हो सकता है। इसके लिए सरकारी और ग़ैर सरकारी संगठनों के स्तर पर तो प्रयास किए ही जाने चाहिए, निजी स्तर पर भी लोगों को इसे खूब प्रोत्साहित किया जाना चाहिए। इसके अतिरिक्त हिंदी भाषियों को भी गैर हिंदी भाषियों को खुले दिल से स्वीकार करना होगा। उनकी भाषा-संस्कृति को समझना होगा तभी वो हिंदी को खुले मन से स्वीकार करने को तैयार होंगे।



In this category, a Swachhata Lakshit Ekayi (Cleanliness Target Unit) was identified, and a major cleanliness drive was conducted on September 28, 2024. This initiative aimed to clear accumulated garbage from neglected areas, enhancing both health and aesthetics. The drive was organized in collaboration with the Dorbar Shnong, Golf Link, Shillong, and involved NEC officers, staff, and local residents. A substantial amount of plastic and organic waste was cleared with assistance from the local sanitary body.

Activities included cleaning clogged drains, uprooting weeds,

and properly segregating waste before disposal.

Spotlight on the North East Entrepreneurship Development Programme (NEEDP)

The North East Entrepreneurship Development Programme (NEEDP), initiated by the Indian Institute of Management Calcutta Innovation Park (IIMCIP), is making significant strides in fostering entrepreneurship across the eight states of Northeast India. Launched on September 2, 2022, and was set to conclude at the end of 2023, the program had an approved budget of ₹14.90 crore and aimed to empower local entrepreneurs through a structured incubation approach.

Empowering Entrepreneurs: The Selection Process

The program kicked off with the North East Entrepreneurship Challenge, designed to select promising enterprises from all eight North Eastern states. Through a transparent and systematic selection process, 270 entrepreneurs were identified and are currently undergoing incubation. This unique initiative aims to equip these entrepreneurs with essential skills and knowledge for their business journeys.

Tailored Mentorship and Training

During the incubation phase, participants benefit from comprehensive training sessions covering key business areas such as product development, marketing, operations management, finance, and fundraising. Each entrepreneur is paired with a mentor—an expert from their specific domain—drawing from a vast pool of professionals, including founders, C-suite executives, investors, and academicians. This one-on-one mentorship approach is crucial for guiding entrepreneurs through the complexities of building and scaling their businesses.

Growing Impact and Success Stories

The NEEDP program has witnessed positive outcomes. Key highlights include

Extensive Outreach: The program has reached over 1.8 million individuals through social media, generating significant interest with over 2,200 applications received.

Diverse Partner Network: A robust network of partners has been established, involving various organizations and institutions in the Northeast, fostering collaboration and support.

Cohort Formation: For the first time, a large Pan Northeast cohort of 270 enterprises has been formed, facilitating a sense of community and shared learning.

Funding Success: Rapid funding has been secured for a substantial number of entrepreneurs in a remarkably short time.

Networking Opportunities: The program has successfully cultivated collaboration among the cohort, enhancing their collective potential.

Innovative IT Tools: IIMCIP has utilized proprietary IT tools, including an application collection portal and a knowledge management platform, to streamline operations and support entrepreneurs.

State Support: All eight state governments have shown robust support for startup initiatives, aligning with the program's objectives

Engaging Events: 8 boot camps, 1 entrepreneur's summit and 2 exhibitions have been organized, attracting over 2,500 attendees and providing invaluable networking opportunities.

Mentor Network: A strong network of over 55 mentors has been forged, featuring leading experts from various sectors.

Revenue Growth: 101 enterprises witnessed more than 50% revenue growth in FY23-24 as compared to FY22-23 and 27 enterprises have started to generate their first revenues under the program's support.
